Minutes from Rossica Board of Directors Meeting

October 2, 2021

In attendance: Ray Pietruszka, Greg Mirsky, Semyon Brayman, Bill Moskoff, Dave Skipton, Randy Woodward and Vesma Grinfelds

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 AM (PDT) by President Ray Pietruszka with a quorum. <u>Treasurer's Report</u>: In Treasurer, Steve Volis' absence, Vesma Grinfelds gave the report as Steve had noted to her. "There are 273 active members. There is \$27,000+ in the Treasury".

<u>Library Report:</u> Greg Mirsky, Librarian, noted that more inquiries are taking place. The Rossica Facebook group is growing with about 250 members now from all over the world. We can probably try to do some membership promotion as about 1/2 of the 250 are likely not members.

His garage space is shrinking but still is OK for the Rossica library.

Catalogs should be sent to him via media mail and he will sort out the catalogs and add them to our library as needed.

Randy asked is he should put a note in the Bulletin asking for material be sent to Greg in this manner. Website: As per Steve's report, we need to make sure that the exhibits are migrated to the new site and that they are scaled.

<u>Publications Report:</u> Bill noted that we are in good shape and that the Journal will be out in 2-3 weeks. All articles are completed and the proofing is almost complete. Currently, the Journal is "over-subscribed". Three articles which were submitted will be in the Spring Journal.

At GASS, the Journal was awarded a Gold Medal but the evaluation form from the Jury was sketchy with nothing concrete noted. <u>Bulletin:</u> Randy noted that all is running smoothly. Short articles (1 page items) are needed <u>Journal Article Awards:</u> Ray informed us that that the winners are being announced in the Journal along with a picture of the medal. This is being done in the President's Letter.

Secretary's Report: Concerning our 2022 National Meeting, Vesma has been approached by the Rocky Mountain Stamp Show (Denver) asking if we would consider meeting at their Show. Ray noted that the last time Rossica met in Denver, it was not a good turn-out. Ray will ask Stee to identify where most of our members are located. Suggestions for venues in 2022 include: FLOREX, CHICAGOPEX and WESTPEX. Vesma will check will all of these potential choices and report back to XXXXX

New Business: Elections are to be held in 2022 for the 2023-2025 term. The slate of nominees should go out in the summer with the election to be completed by the end of the year. The request for nominations should go out via the Bulletin or a separate e-mail. In the past, voting was by a paper ballot; it should be fine these days via e-mail. It was agreed that the election shall be held electronically.

Ray stated that he would like to remain on the Board but will not run for President. Dave Skipton does not wish to run for the Board. All other current Board members wish to run and retain their positions.

The next Board meeting will be held via Zoom. Meeting adjourned at 11:00 (PDT).



The 1st edition of the catalog was sold out in the record time. In 2019, the catalog received Gold medal at the World Philatelic Exhibition in China as well as Large Gold medals at Philatelic Exhibitions in USA. The catalog was purchased by stamp dealers and collectors from 35 countries around the globe.

News from the American Philatelic Research Library

A.M. LaVey

I would like to report that I applied for and received a grant from the Association for Slavic, East European, and Eurasian Studies--a scholarly society dedicated to the advancement of knowledge about the former Soviet Union, and East and Central Europe--to work with the American Philatelic Research Library's collection of Russian, Soviet and Post-Soviet materials.

I travelled to Bellefonte, Pennsylvania and spent the months of June and July working with the collection with the intent to increase discoverability of the library's Russian-language resources. In addition to the reference inquiries and research requests, here are some of the things I did during this time:

- In-processed and cataloged a backlog of 210 physical and digital Russian resources
- Updated and corrected Russianlanguage transliterated catalog records according to the American Library Association-Library of Congress Romanization table.
- Created and completed a template for the processing and cataloging Belarusian, Russian and Ukrainianlanguage resources. This template will assist the library in the future with processing, cataloging and organizing materials in these areas.
- Modernized and consolidated the catalog records for 52 Russian, Soviet and Post-Soviet serials-including our very own Rossica Journal
- Researched and made updates to the APRL Manual of Philatelic Headings for Armenia, Azerbaijan, Carpatho-Ukraine, Belarus. Estonia, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Lithuania, Moldova, Russian Empire, Russian Federation, Soviet Union, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine and Uzbekistan
- Reorganized the physical shelving area for the Russian Empire / USSR / Russian Federation, created specific classification for Russian cities and regions, and relocated

the Russian gazetteers to a single shelf.

 Indexed the Russian-language research journal

Научно-практический семинар по истории почты и филателии (Scientific and practical seminar on the history of mail and philately) and completed an updated index for the Ukrainian Philatelist.

The library certainly has a wealth of resources in support of Russian philately. I can confirm that some materials are the only such resources in the United States. Many Russian authors donate copies of their monographs to the library, but unless someone at the library processes them—they are no good for researchers. Some of the materials I processed were from the World Stamp Show-NY 2016! I hope that my work will make our future research more successful!
